

DROP-OFF/CHECK-IN

Please enter the church through the front or side doors. You will be greeted by a volunteer who will direct you to the check-out table.
Once you are at the check in table you will receive a sticker that contains your child/ren's name and a three digit code. Whoever is picking up your child/ren will need to have this code (or a photo of the code) to collect them. Once you've received your code a leader from your child/ren's crew will take them and all their belongings into Celebration Hall where they will start their day with a bang!

PICK-UP/CHECK-OUT

Please enter the church through the front or side doors. You will be greeted by a volunteer who will direct you to the check-out table. Once you are at the check -out table you will show the check-out volunteer the sticker or a picture of the sticker given to you at check-in. You will then be directed into Celebration Hall to your child/rens crew huddle where the crew leader will give you a clipboard to sign in order to successfully check out your child/ren.





WHAT TO BRING TO VBS

We ask that every camper comes to VBS:

- Suncreen already applied
- A lunch
- A water bottle

VBS will provide two daily snacks (with allergy friendly options available)

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO VBS

Please do not bring the following:

- Electronics of any kind
- Toys from home
- Valuables
- Anything you wouldn't want lost, wet or dirty.

LUNCH

VBS does not provide lunches, so send your child with a packed lunch. We do not provide refrigerators for storage. We are also a nut free zone, please pack lunches accordingly.

LOST AND FOUND

All items misplaced will be put on a table beside the patio door. Please be sure to check this table if your child is missing anything.



ALLERGIES/MEDICATIONS

Parents of children with allergies are required to list the allergies on the medical form (completed at registration). In order to administer any medication an authorization form needs to be signed by parents on Monday morning. Each child with an allergy will be provided a daily wristband labeled with their allergy to be worn throughout camp. A camper's epi-pen or puffers must be kept on the child or in their backpack at all times in case of emergency.

Camper Washroom Breaks

Crew Leaders or helpers will accompany children to the washroom along with two other campers. The crew leader will remain outside the washrooms while the child goes to the washroom. Once both children are finished and back with the crew leader, they return to their station.

Volunteer Washroom Breaks

All volunteers and adults onsite are asked to please use the washrooms in the hall beside the Hub or in washroom upstairs attached to the C.I.A. room.



Discipline Policy

VBS volunteers will try their best to facilitate a fun and safe environment where campers can learn about God. If a camper is having trouble with their behaviour we will use the following structure to facilitate good behaviour.

- REMIND the child of the rule being broken and attempt to stop the cause of the problem.
- REDIRECT the child's focus and actions positively. Suggest what the child should be doing.
- REMOVE an appropriate privilege.
- REFER the child will be directed to the child's supervisor for additional help. The supervisor may give further appropriate corrections (like positive, one-on-one attention) or may discuss the child's behaviour with parents.

While VBS volunteers do their best to encourage appropriate behaviour and provide the best programming to all campers, VBS will use a four strike policy to ensure safe and appropriate behaviour.

Strike One: Camper would be disciplined appropriately and a discussion would occur with the camper to prevent a similar incident in the future. Parents would be notified at the end of the day.


Strike Two: Parents would be called and notified along with further discipline and discussion. This may include missing a fun anticipated activity.

Strike Three: Parents would be called and the camper would be sent home for the rest of the day.

Strike Four: If after returning to camp, the camper continues to misbehave and receives a fourth strike, the camper will not be permitte to come back to camp for the rest of the week.


VBS is a privilege, not a right. If a camper refuses to listen and causes stress to leaders, it will not be tolerated.

Day 1: Magnify God






Day 4: Magnify God's Forgiveness



Nicodemus visited Jesus at night. Jesus taught Nicodemus about God's kingdom. Some time later, Jesus died on a cross. Nicodemus helped prepare

Jesus' body to be buried. After three days, some women went to Jesus' tomb. It was empty! Jesus rose from the dead so that those who receive His gift of forgiveness can be part of God's family forever.
